NOTICE OF EMERGENCY REGULATION

SPECIFIC REASONS FOR FINDING AN IMMEDIATE DANGER TO THE PUBLIC, HEALTH, SAFETY OR WELFARE: The Florida Legislature enacted the General Appropriations Act for the fiscal year commencing on July 1, 2005. Proviso language in the Act permits university boards of trustees substantial latitude to determine tuition and fee increases for the 2005-2006 fiscal year. The University of Florida Board of Trustees must exercise its

permits university boards of trustees substantial latitude to determine tuition and fee increases for the 2005-2006 fiscal year. The University of Florida Board of Trustees must exercise its authority immediately to set tuition and fees in order to properly perform budgetary planning and administer its budget for the coming fiscal year. Thus, while time alone is not sufficient to justify an emergency regulation, it is important to the fiscal welfare of the University and the State of Florida that the University implement its authority as granted in the Appropriations Act. The University must proceed with the regulation authorizing tuition increases on an emergency basis.

REASONS FOR CONCLUDING THAT THE PROCEDURE USED IS FAIR UNDER

THE CIRCUMSTANCES: The Board of Trustees will consider and approve the proposed Emergency Regulation at its meeting on August 17, 2005. The emergency regulation will be noticed through the University of Florida's Regulations website. Further, a non-emergency regulation is noticed simultaneously with this notice on the University of Florida's Regulations website. The tuition and fee amounts in the Emergency Regulation were approved by the Board of Trustees at its publicly noticed meeting on June 14, 2005. The Emergency Regulation divides the student population into subsets using residency status, new or continuing student status, graduate or undergraduate status, and enrolled academic program and assigns an approved tuition and fee amount to each subset of students.

SUMMARY OF THE REGULATION: Tuition Costs for the 2005-2006 academic year are set forth in the amended rule. They are differentiated for residents and non-residents. Except in the case of resident undergraduate and non-resident College of Medicine M.D. Tuition Costs, "New Students," as defined in the amendments, are charged a greater amount than "Continuing Students."

RULES OF

UNIVERSITY OF FLORIDA

6C1-3.0375 Finance and Administration; Tuition Cost.

- (1) Tuition Cost shall be defined as tuition and fees assessed to students for enrollment in credit courses at the University of Florida. Tuition Cost consists of the following tuition and fees, depending on whether a student is a resident or a non-resident:
- (a) Resident Tuition Cost, comprised of the following, shall be defined as the tuition and fees charged an enrolled student who qualifies as a Florida resident as defined in Rule 6C-7.005, F.A.C.:
 - 1. <u>Resident Tuition</u>;
 - 2. Student Financial Aid Fee;
 - 3. Capital Improvement Trust Fund Fee;
 - 4. Building Fee;
 - 5. Transportation Access Fee;
 - 6. Health Fee;
 - 7. Athletic Fee; and
 - 8. Activity and Service Fee.
- (b) Non-Resident Tuition Cost, comprised of the following, shall be defined as the tuition and fees charged an enrolled student who does not qualify as a Florida resident as defined in Rule 6C-7.005, F.A.C.:
 - 1. <u>Resident Tuition</u>;
 - 2. Non-Resident Tuition:

- 23. Non-Resident Fee;
- 34. Student Financial Aid Fee:
- 45. Non-Resident Student Financial Aid Fee;
- <u>56</u>. Capital Improvement Trust Fund Fee;
- 67. Building Fee;
- <u>98</u>. Transportation Access Fee;
- 109. Health Fee;
- 1110. Athletic Fee; and
- 1211. Activity and Service Fee.
- (2) <u>EnrollmentRegistration</u> shall be defined as consisting of two components:
- (a) Formal <u>registration</u>enrollment in one or more credit courses approved and scheduled by the University; and,
- (b) Payment of Tuition Costs, or other appropriate arrangements for payment (installment payment, deferment, or third party billing) for the courses in which the student is registeredenrolled as of the end of the drop/add period.
- (3) A student is liable for Tuition Costs associated with all courses for which the student is registered at the end of the drop/add period. The Tuition Cost payment deadline is 3:30 p.m. <u>Friday of the last day</u> of the second week of class.
- (4) The following Tuition Costs shall be levied and collected effective the 2005-2006 academic yearfall semester indicated for each student regularly enrolled and will vary dependent upon the following categories:, unless provided otherwise in this chapter.
- (a) <u>"Continuing Student" is defined as a degree-seeking student admitted prior to the</u>
 Fall 2005 term and enrolled in the Summer 2005 term or Spring 2005 term. However, any such

student shall become a 'New Student" upon receipt of a degree or upon the student's admission or readmission to a degree program requiring a new application, whichever is sooner. A "term" for the purposes of defining a "Continuing Student" and a "New Student" hereunder shall mean for the fall, the fall semester, for the spring, the spring semester, and for the summer, any of the summer sessions.

Students enrolled in programs other than the MD, DMD or DVM in the College of Medicine, College of Dentistry, or College of Veterinary Medicine, will be assessed the following Tuition Cost per credit hour:

- (b) "New Student" is defined as any student other than a "Continuing Student," including any of the following:
- 1. any first-time-admitted degree-seeking student of the University of Florida registered for the Fall 2005, Spring 2006, or Summer 2006 term;
 - 2. any non-degree seeking student;
- 3. any current or past University of Florida student who through a new application is admitted or readmitted to a degree program for the Fall 2005, Spring 2006, or Summer 2006 term; or
- 4. any University of Florida student who is readmitted after an absence of two or more consecutive terms, excluding military withdrawals.

(c) Pursuant to Section 1009.285, F.S., each student enrolled in the same undergraduate course more than twice, shall be assessed an additional \$170.22169.12 per credit hour charge in addition to the Tuition Costs outlined above in section-paragraph (4)(a), for each such course.

- graduate assistant for at least 0.25 FTE shall be charged non-resident Tuition Costs. Upon completion of the appointment, such person shall be charged resident Tuition Costs classified as a Florida resident for tuition purposes for the remainder of his or her graduate career in any semester in which he or she receives a waiver of all tuition fees or all tuition fees are paid from University funds. If the student loses the waiver or tuition remission under this provision for any semester, he or she shall be liable for Tuition Costs for that semester based on his or her out-of-state residency classification.
- (6) The Provost has the authority to designate programs in which Non-Resident Tuition Cost, or any portion thereof, are waived when such waiver is in support of the mission of the University and is consistent with policies specifically approved by the board of trustees.
